## **Asbestos** in schools

The health, safety and well-being of children and staff is the highest priority of Education Oueensland.

It is Education Queensland policy to remove asbestos immediately from schools should it deteriorate and represent a health threat.

The following steps have been taken to address the presence and removal of asbestos in schools:

- All identified loosely bonded asbestos was removed from Queensland state schools in the 1990s following a statewide audit.
- \$120 million has been allocated to remove all state school roofs containing asbestos as quickly as possible, availability of skilled labour and weather permitting.

- The accelerated Asbestos Roof Replacement Program will result in the replacement of more than 930 roofs at more than 340 schools.
- Because the removal of asbestos roofs involves highly-specialised labour and current work is soaking up industry capacity, the Government is working to expand the asbestosremoval industry by bringing forward this injection of new funds.

All tradespeople working at a school are provided with its building management plan before work commences. If the work involves materials containing asbestos, a work method safety plan is followed to ensure all safety precautions and removal processes are followed.
